Leader in Me - #4 Think Win - Win

Think Win-Win is the belief that everyone can win. It's not me or you —it is both of us. It is a belief that there are enough good things for everyone; it is an abundant way of thinking. Think Win-Win is being happy for others when good things happen to them. As a parent, not

everything is negotiable, but if you go into discussions with your child with a win-win mindset, you'll find a lot less resistance.

• Play a game with your child(ren) that has a definite winner. Explain how competition is okay when you play a game, but it is not okay in relationships. Discuss how tense it would be in your home if every situation had to have a winner. A better way to think is win-win. This means we think of solutions that we can all feel good about when there is a problem. The more we Think Win-Win, the fewer problems there will be. You may want to display a chart listing the days of the week. When someone is "caught" thinking win-win, he or she gets to write his or her name on the chart for that day.

Home Influences on Early Reading Ability in Children

Research By: Durkin, Children Who Read Early



The following factors were present in the homes of early readers:

- Availability of numerous and different types of reading materials
- A special place where reading occurs
- Lots of writing materials available
- Parents read to their children regularly
- Siblings play school often
- Screen time reduced to less than 10 hours per week, and interaction takes place during screen time (talking about what is being learned during that time)
- Parents read books themselves
- Parents take children to public events, displays and shopping
- Parents are willing to answer their child's questions
- Words and letters are displayed around the house

DROP-OFF/PICK-UP LANE

The times before and right after school are busy with little bodies trying to get to where they are supposed to be. To make the drop-off/pick-up lane a safer place, we ask that you be aware of the following:

- 1. Please do not leave your car parked and unattended in the drop-off/pick-up lane. Park in a stall if you must leave your car.
- 2. Please do not have your students cross through the parking lot to get to you or your car. Instead, go over to your students and escort them to your car staying on the sidewalks.
- 3. Please do not park anywhere that blocks the sight lines of drivers entering or exiting the drop-off/pick-up lane.
- 4. Keep the line moving. If you must stop for longer than a few minutes, please find a parking stall.
